

Day 1: Arriving at Larnaca Airport 3.Geroskipou Village : Geroskipou village

1. Meet & greet at Larnaca Airport.

2.Check-in to the hotel in Larnaca

3. Overnight Larnaca (HB)

Day 2: Trodos&Omodos

1.Kakopetria village: A well-preserved village with traditional picturesque houses. There you will get the chance to walk around the quaint little village known for its running waters and mini waterfall and mingle with the friendly locals.

2.Trodos Mountains: where the forest stretches as far as the eye can see. We stop at Troodos Square, the highest point of Troodos Mountains, where free time will be given for lunch (optional extra). Situated right in the heart of the island, this location offers some of the most breathtaking views in Cyprus

3.Omodos: The village is built around the Holy Cross monastery, one of the oldest and most sacred monasteries in the island. Omodos is a famous wine producing village with lots of small shops that you can visit during your free time to taste and buy some of the best local Cypriot wine and other handmade products.

Day 3: Paphos&Curium (Optional)

1.Ancient Curium: Ancient Curium, one of themost important archeological sites on the island. There you will have the chance to see the Greco-Roman theater where gladiator games were held and the House of Eustolios with its mosaics and bath establishments the site sits on a 100-meter hill right next to the sea and offers breathtaking views of the coast of Episkopi Bay.

2.Paphos Town: Pafos where you will have the chance to visit the House of Dionysus, which is famous for its ancient mosaics (optional extra). You will also have free time to relax, have lunch (optional extra) and enjoy the area surrounding Pafos Harbour, which is one of the most visited and beautiful tourist resorts of the island.



3.Geroskipou Village : Geroskipou village where you can taste and buy traditional sweet Cyprus delights, a local delicacy made there since 1895.

4.Aphorodite Rock: Rock of Aphrodite which is the legendary birthplace of Aphrodite, Greek goddess of beauty and love. According to Greek mythology, as soon as Aphrodite was created from the foam of the sea, although she had originally begun drifting towards the Greek island of Cythera the wind blew her towards her spiritual home near Pafos. According to ancient legends, anyone that swims around the Rock of Aphrodite is blessed with eternal beauty! Time is given there for photos before we drive back to the east coast of the island.

Day 4: Larnaca, Lefkara & Nicosia

1.Larnaca: Where you will see the magnificent Ayios Lazarus Church - one of the finest examples of Byzantine architecture.

2.Lefkara: One of the most beautiful and traditional villages in the island, famous for its traditional handicrafts of lace embroidery and filigree silver. Legend has it that the famous painter, Leonardo da Vinci himself visited the village in 1481 and bought a lace altar cloth, which he donated to the Milan Cathedral. The character of the village is very picturesque with narrow winding streets and traditional terracotta-roofed houses.

3.Nicosia: The only divided city in the Europe, by driving through the venetian walls. Passing by the newly restored Famagusta Gate, proceed through Archbishop Palace ending to famous shopping area called Ledra Street where we cross the borderlines to the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus. As soon as we crossed the borderline we will visit Buyukhan (Caravansarai) is the largest caravansarai on the island of Cyprus. It was build in 1572 by the Ottomans and being restored late 90s.



Passing through the narrow streets and arriving at St Sofia Cathedral. St Sofia is a former Christian cathedral converted into a mosque, located in North Nicosia. It has historically been the main mosque on the island of Cyprus. The Selimiye Mosque is housed in the largest and oldest surviving Gothic church in Cyprus.

Day 5: Kyrenia, St Hilarion & Bellapais

1.St Hilarion Castle: St Hilarion Castle, the inspiration for Disney's iconic Snow White's Castle. Walk in the footsteps of Lusignan kings and Crusader knights to Prince John's Tower at the very top, to take in the breath-taking views.

2.Bellapais Abbey: It's a scenic journey into the Five Finger Mountains to beautiful Bellapais Abbey, an Augustinian monastery first built by monks in 1198. Your entertaining licensed tour guide will reveal the fascinating history of the "Abbaye de la paix" with its courtyard pavilions and magnificent Gothic refectory set on a flat mountain terrace. Soak up the lovely views from the walls down to the shimmering North Cyprus coastline below, or take a short stroll around Bellapais village, the inspiration for writer Laurence Durrell's book "Bitter Lemons".

3.Kyrenia Castle : One of the main attractions in Kyrenia is the Kyrenia Castle, which was originally built by the Byzantines in the 7th century and later expanded by the Venetians and Ottomans. The castle now houses a museum with exhibits on the city's history and culture.

Day 6: Famagusta, Salamis, St Barnaba& Ghost Town Varosha

1.Salamis: Behold the majesty of Salamis, which once served as the splendid capital of Cyprus for over a millennium. Immerse yourself in the rich culture and history of this remarkable site, considered a beacon of significance not only in Cyprus but throughout the entire Mediterranean region.

2.St Barnabas : The St. Barnabas Monastery and Icon museum is situated close to the Royal Tombs between the village of Tuzla and the ruins of Salamis. The site consists of a church now serving as the museum, holding a stunning collection of Cypriot artefacts dating back as far as the 7th century BC, the monastery now sheltering an archaeological collection, and a chapel housing the tomb of the saint.

3.Famagusta Old Town : Through modern Famagusta and into the old walled city for a walking tour. Marvel at the mighty city walls built by the Venetians to resist invaders. In the heart of town, discover the 14th century St Nicholas Cathedral, now the simple yet impressive Lala Mustafa Pasha Mosque.

4.Ghost Town Varosha: Varosha was a bustling resort with high-rise hotels and smart villas before the events of 1974. Now it's a ghost town trapped in the no-go border area between north. Overnight Hotel in Kyrenia (HB)

Day 7 : Güzelyurt, Soli Ruins, St Mamas Jeep Safari

1.Soli Ruins: This ancient settlement is one of the ten ancient kingdoms of Cyprus dating to the 6th century BC. Located near the town of Lefke and southwest of Guzelyurt, what remains today at the coastal site of Soli dates mainly to the Roman era. It is believed to have been founded by the Athenians returning from the Trojan Wars in the 13th century BCE and the region was first known as 'Aipeia'.

2.St Mamas: Dedicated to the island's beloved tax-repelling patron saint, the church was formerly the site of a pagan temple. St. Mamas Monastery in Guzelyurt is the third most important place of worship for the Greek Orthodox in North Cyprus, after the St. Barnabas Tomb at Famagusta and the Apostolos Andreas Monastery in Karpaz. Today it also houses several significant icons and artefacts

3.Jeep Safari at Akdeniz, Kormakitis & Kayalar Villages: Our fun and safe off-road 4x4 adventure takes us on a scenic tour of the Kyrenia mountain range. 2.Büyükkonuk Eco-Village: It offers visitors to practice in milking goats, in preparation of traditional cheese Hellim, in collection of olives from the trees and in the production of olive oil, which afterwards you can take with you. All visitors of the eco-villages, at their request, have the opportunity to walk along the best brightly blooming fields in North Cyprus together with the shepherds and herds of sheep. This is an unforgettable experience - pure nature! On the territory of the village is a small village shop called Delcraft. This shop is selling the handmade products of the Turkish Cypriots, which they use or have used before in their daily lives, as well as a wide selection of home-made dishes such as honey, jams and olive oil.

3.Karpaz National Park : Inevitably, we'll have to stop to meet the feral donkeys that live wild here. They usually demand a carrot or an apple or six before we can pass! Feel free to make photos!

4.Apostolos Andreas Monastery & Golden Beach: One of the 'must see' North Cyprus attractions. Legend says that the Apostle Andrew landed here and created a spring with a single strike of his staff. Soak up the atmosphere in this important Cyprus monastery, and taste the healing spring waters alongside the many pilgrims who travel here. The Karpaz has some of the most glorious beaches in Cyprus. If time and weather permit, your tour bus will stop at the best of them all, Golden Beach.

1.Saint Hillarion : Perched high in the Kyrenia mountain range, overlooking the Mediterranean and the surrounding areas of North Cyprus, stands the castle of St Hilarion. Reputedly the inspiration for Walt Disney's 'Sleeping Beauty', the castle remains one of the best preserved of all the Crusader Castles, thanks mainly to the work of the North Cyprus Antiquities Department.

2.Bellapais: Next is the Abbey of Bellapais, also known as the Monastery of Peace. The romantic setting will take your breath away as you approach this Gothic-style architectural masterpiece. Built in the 12th century AD by the Masons for Augustinian Monks from Jerusalem, this abbey is one of the best examples of its kind. The Bellapais village also inspired renowned British writer Lawrence Durrell's famous book "Bitter Lemons".

3.Kyrenia Castle: In Kyrenia, we will see the historical Kyrenia Castle, which was built to protect the city, and its dungeons, the archaeological museum and the second oldest shipwreck in the world that has been excavated so far, which is 2300 years old. Then, after taking a bird's eye view of the historical Kyrenia port, which was used for commercial purposes in the past and turned the island into the largest trade center of the Middle East, we go to our hotel.

FOOTPRINTS OF ST PAUL IN CYPRUS

(3 NIGHTS - 4 DAYS)

Day 1: Arrival & Salamis - St Barnabas - Famagusta Excurison

Arrive either Larnaca airport or Ercan airport as early as possible before midday to be in Larnaca area.

Begin today with Famagusta on the Eastern Coast. The old city is surrounded by one of the best-preserved Venetian fortifications in the eastern Mediterranean. The city was important during the Lusignan period on the Island. King Guy de Lusignan built 365 churches, one for each day of the year. Most of the churches and renaissance buildings are in ruins bearing the scars of the Ottoman siege of 1571. View the citadel, also known as Othello's Tower. A stone stage in the central courtyard was used until recently for performances of Shakespeare's tragedy "Othello" and Martinengo bastion, City walls & Palace. Other churches to visit in this area are Nestorian Church (of St George the Exiler), the Twin Churches (of Templars and Hospitallers). The larger of the two churches built in the 14th century belonged to the Knights Templars. Visit the cathedral of St. Nicholas /Lala Mustafa Pasha Mosque is the largest medieval building in Famagusta and was commenced in 1300 AD. Other churches are St George Greek church and St Peter & St Paul church /Sinan Pasa Mosque. Continue to the archaeological site of ancient Salamis, the birthplace of St Barnabas. When St Paul & St Barnabas came to Cyprus in 45 AD accompanied by Mark, they had travelled from Antioch to Silesia and from there by ship to Cyprus, arriving at Salamis, the largest port on the island at the time. (Acts 13.5) Visit the impressive Greco Roman monuments excavated here. Its huge necropolis of Royal tombs features burial customs like those described by Homer. Explore the Roman city with its elegant colonnade, hypocaust, mosaics & monuments.

Visit the monastery of St Barnabas, founded on the site of the apostle Barnabas, and is a reminder of the important role Cyprus played in the history of Christianity in the Mediterranean. Barnabas was born in Salamis and joined the apostle Paul to spread the Gospel through Cyprus and Asia Minor. St Barnabas Church houses artifacts from the Bronze Age site of Enkomi of Salamis. It is thought that the apostle is buried in the tombs underneath the church.

Transfer to hotel in Nicosia. Check in to your hotel.

Day 2: Paphos & St. Neophytos Monastery

Visit Pafos on the west coast and discover the remarkable history of Pafos town which UNESCO awarded the coveted title 'World Heritage Site'. Paul and Barnabas headed west to Paphos, passed Amathus and then Kourion, both cities perched high on cliffs. Stop to view Petra tou Romiou (Aphrodite's Rock) it is here where according to the legend that the goddess of love & beauty was born. View the amazing landscape of the area combining sea and mountains.

Pass by Ayia Solomoni church home to 12th century Christian catacombs, to the archaeological sites from the Neolithic period. Visit the archaeological park. See the Roman Villas with their extensive floor mosaics are of particular interest with new ones still being excavated since it is widely believed that there are many treasures still to be discovered. Admire a series of beautifully preserved mosaics depicting scenes from Greek Mythology such as the "House of Dionysos" (the god of wine) is one of the largest and best known of the mosaic houses. The "House of Theseus" (Thesesus killing the Minotaur) is another Roman house of which an earlier version of it may very well have been the residence of Sergius Paulus, the proconsul (Roman governor of Cyprus), who is mentioned in Acts 13:4-12, and who was converted to Christianity by St Paul. This palace has been under excavation by a Polish team since 1966. Visit the fascinating site of St Paul's Pillar, once home to one of Paphos largest religious structures. What remains are the foundations of a 4th Century Christian Basilica, demonstrating the size and magnificence of the original church and one of the largest on the Island.

Destroyed during Arab raids in 653, several marble columns remain from the colonnades and others are scattered around the site. St. Paul's Pillar, is where, Saint Paul was flogged before the Roman Governor Sergius Paulus who later converted to Christianity. The Apostles managed to convert the Roman Proconsul who embraced the Christian faith thereby making Cyprus the first country in the world to be governed by a Christian. A small church of Ayia Kyriaki on the site is now used for Anglican, Lutheran and Greek Orthodox services.

We journey to the hills above Paphos to visit the Byzantine Monastery of Ayios Neophytos where we view the cave that St Neophytos excavated in a peaceful corner of this beautiful, dramatic landscape in the 12th century. The hermit's cave, called the 'Enkleistra', is decorated with some of the finest examples of Byzantine wall paintings, dating from the 12th to the 15th centuries. The monastery that developed around the cave now houses an excellent ecclesiastical museum. Wisit the harbour area with its small castle in the distance. Return to hotel in Nicosia.

Day 3: St Lazarus Church & Departure

Visit the magnificent church of St Lazarus, built by Emperor Leo VI, in the 9th century. Restoration was carried out in the 17th century and is one of the finest examples of Byzantine architecture. Lazarus of Bethany whom Jesus Christ resurrected four days after his death came by boat to Cyprus and landed in Kition where he met the Apostles Paul and Barnabas. He lived on the Island for another thirty years. He was buried under the sanctuary in a hidden tomb. Walk along the Finikoudes Promenade the famous palm tree lined seafront with the medieval castle standing in the water's edge. Departure.
